UNIFORM POLICY

RATIONALE

The wearing of school uniform reinforces in students a sense of value in their own appearance, instills recognition of themselves as an integral part of the school community, and assists in developing pride in representing their school. Issues of equality, health and safety, and expense are also factors that have contributed to the establishment of a Uniform Policy for the school.

DEFINITION

The School Uniform has been developed to provide choice, allow for students to safely engage in the varied school activities, and to cater for the financial constraints of families. The School Uniform is defined as:

Students may choose to wear either the summer or winter uniform but should not mix items.

Broad brimmed or legionnaires hat with school logo are compulsory from Sept 1st – May 1st regardless of whether the summer or winter uniform is worn.

The school back pack is part of the school uniform.

The School Council operates a Uniform Shop that stocks most of these items.

IMPLEMENTATION

The following guidelines apply as implementation elements of this policy:-

1. The wearing of the School Uniform as defined within this Policy will be compulsory at all times within the school.
2. The wearing of the school hat, either broad brimmed or legionnaire style, is compulsory for all outdoor activities (including breaks) during September 1st to May 1st in support of the school's SunSmart policy.
3. Parents may seek exemption to the Uniform Policy due to religious beliefs, cultural background, student disability, health condition or economic hardship and should discuss their needs with the Principal.
4. The School Council will operate a "not for profit" Uniform Shop and Second Hand Uniform Shop which will stock all items of the School Uniform except for footwear.
5. Details of uniform items and places for purchase, will be published in the newsletter at the start of the year and seasonally.
6. A special Year 6 Commemorative Windcheater/Jacket will be offered to all students in Year 6 each year.
7. Extreme hair styles and extreme hair colour are not part of the school uniform and are reserved for special days.
8. Declared 'out of uniform' days will be exempt from school uniform.
9. All garments should be clearly named.
10. Layered clothing must not be visible underneath uniform. ie no non school colours showing around the neck, arms and legs.

IMPLEMENTATION

1. The school uniform has been developed in consultation with the school community and it is expected that all students will wear correct uniform.
2. Students will be reminded to wear correct uniform. Repeated or ongoing breaches of the uniform policy will result in parents being contacted.
3. Students will only be able to represent the school and attend school excursions if they are wearing the correct school uniform.

EVALUATION

This policy will be reviewed as part of the school's policy review cycle.
