# Principal's Report 20th February 2019





1. Our current enrolment is 400 students. This includes 50 Foundation students and 15 new students that commenced with us in years 1-6.

### **Staffing**

- 1. Due to Jayne Setford accepting a teaching position closer to home over the summer break, we have appointed Maria Buttifant as our new Performing Arts teacher. Maria is a very experienced teacher, having taught for over 20 years in both primary and secondary government, independent and catholic schools. She has been placed as a short term vacancy and we will advertise the 12 month position in the coming weeks.
- 2. Our other staff; Julia Rossi (1/2), Marie Petzierides, Alex Bruinewoud (3/4), Sylvia Petrovska and returning (from family leave) Angela Makris (1/2B and 3/4B one day a fortnight) have all settled in to their new schools and roles. They have been well supported by their leaders, as well as an induction program lead by Celene Black and Jeanette Breen in familiarising themselves with the school's curriculum and pedagogy.

## **Professional Learning**

- 1. All members of the School Improvement Team (SIT) have been supported in their leadership development with the introduction of professional coaching sessions with Jade Rawlings (Melbourne AFL Assistant coach). So far the impact has been positive, in particular with our SIT members having a greater understanding of themselves as leaders.
- 2. On Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> February myself, Andrew Veal, David Barnes and Jeanette Breen participated in the validation day of our 2-day school review. Other panel members; Barry Soraghan (reviewer), Mark Flack (DET Senior Education Improvement Leader), Saraid Doherty (Principal, Yarra Primary) and Craig Crouch (Principal, Warrandyte Primary) were also part of the review panel. The day was positive and a testament to all staff, students, parents/guardians and council for providing the right evidence to ensure we are registered as a school (via the VRQA) and that there was no anomalies with our espoused beliefs about where we are on our journey as a school. As part of our VRQA compliance, we need to provide an updated Camps & Excursions policy (ours is from 2010), critical incident plan (derived already from our Emergency management Plan) and a statement on our assessment schedule the mentions the process we use to review student data/outcomes.
