



Dear Parents

We are now asking for expressions of interest for children that would like to take part in the Bulleen Miniball Competition for Term 4.

This competition takes place after school on a Friday at Bulleen Stadium in Sheahans Rd and is aimed at teaching prep aged children the rules and techniques of Basketball while playing a game. Drop down rings are lowered for Miniball and are a good height for children of this age. Game start times vary each week and are between 4 – 5.30pm. The umpire and coaches are on the court throughout the game to explain the rules and instructions to the players. The game consists of 2 x 15 minute halves and is not scored. Learning the rules and how to play the game, whilst having fun, are the main goals of Miniball. No previous experience is necessary.

The season commences the first week back from School Holidays on Friday 11th of October and runs for the term until Friday 6th December.

We will need parents/relatives to help coach and manage the teams or it will not be possible. Please let us know if you can take on or help with either of these roles.

Cost - \$65 per child for the term (we will email you the link).

Uniform – players wear their school uniform – light blue polo and navy shorts/skort/pants and sneakers.
