Emotional Regulation

Come and join a conversation around **Emotional Regulation** with the Wellbeing Team at THPS. We will explore how the brain can serve as a map for showing us how we learn and why we behave the way we do.

Neuroscience provides a wealth of information so we can become more familiar with three key parts of the brain (the amygdala, prefrontal cortex and hippocampus) you'll begin to understand how feelings arise – and that they have the ability to choose our response. In this workshop we will share the strategies and language we use at THPS to support all children in developing self-regulating behaviours.

- Understanding the brain
- Emotional language
- Strategies to support calm behaviour.
