Unfortunately Manningham City Council have informed us that they are finding it difficult to find replacement crossing supervisors. During this time it is so important that we are mindful of all students crossing and ensuring their behaviours are safe.

#### Foods containing nuts

Due to the fact (like all schools) we have students that are anaphylactic to nuts, we <u>strongly discourage students</u> bringing foods containing nuts to school. As part of our anaphylaxis policy, we ensure the safety of all students with severe or anaphylactic reactions. If a child does accidentally bring food to school containing nuts, we must ensure that there is no chance of contamination.

Last night was the last Council meeting for the 2019 year. At our meeting we farewelled our longest standing Treasurer, Martin Roche. Martin has served on Council for 8 years and during that time has provided invaluable support from a school-financial perspective. 


#### **School Fees**

# **Compass News**

Due to the high cost of processing payments via Compass we will no longer offering the Compass payment option. Consent only will be offered. Payments can only be made via Bpay or over the counter using cash or card.

# **CSEF Applications**

CSEF is provided to eligible families to assist with the cost of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

Parents and carers may claim the CSEF of \$125 per year, if you hold an eligible concession card. To apply please contact the office or download a CSEF application form from <a href="www.education.vic.gov.au/csef">www.education.vic.gov.au/csef</a> and provide us with a copy of a current concession card. Closing date for application is Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> April 2020. For more information visit the above web site.

You will only need to submit an application form in 2020 if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments: your child has started or changed schools in 2020 or you did not apply at the same school in 2019 or
- **changed family circumstances:** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing at the school in 2020.
