PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

NAIDOC Week

The theme of this years' National Aborigines and Islanders Day Observance Committee (NAIDOC) is Always Was, Always Will Be. The week is all about recognising that First Nations people have occupied and cared for Australia for over 65,000 years. Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people were Australia's first explorers, first navigators, first



engineers, first farmers, first botanists, first scientists, first diplomats, first astronomers and first artists.

NAIDOC Week 2020 acknowledges and celebrates that our nation's story didn't begin with documented European contact whether in 1770 or 1606 - with the arrival of the Dutch on the western coast of the Cape York Peninsula. The very first footprints on this continent were those belonging to First Nations peoples. NAIDOC 2020 invites all Australians to embrace the true history of Australia – a history which dates back thousands of generations.

Throughout this week students will be participating in activities that help them to learn about the First Nations' 65,000+ year history of this country - which is Australian history. It is also about having Australians celebrate the oldest continuing cultures on the planet.

Remembrance Day



Yesterday all students took part in standing for a minutes' silence to commemorate Remembrance Day and also listen to *The Last Post*. It is important to continue these short, yet meaningful events for our students to be reminded of the men and women who gave their lives in war time so future generations can live free of tyranny and repression. *Lest we forget*.

Reports and Learning Growth

On a personal note for my own primary-school aged children, the past 6 months presented its challenges as they fluctuated with their commitment, emotions and dare I say it, their attitude. For many students, their learning was disrupted during online/remote learning. Due to this, academic learning growth will look different for your child's semester 2 report. This is to be expected and it's ok. The most important aspect of supporting students in their learning is identifying where their point of need is to ensure that our teachers know what content they need to teach to build understandings. Next year we will be receiving funding for tutors to support our literacy and numeracy programs. The strategy on how to effectively use our tutors will be developed as part of our annual plan for 2021.

Colin was someone who embodied our school values of **respect, responsibility, courage** and **persistence**. Tragically, Colin passed away in 1998 and his loss deeply impacted the school community. As a result, the school wanted to honour and remember both the vast contributions Colin made, but also more importantly the strong values that his character represented. Every year we celebrate Colin's legacy and recognise one year 6 student who over the course of their time at Templestowe Heights Primary exemplified the contributions and values that Colin exhibited. An honour board located in the administration area lists the names of the students that have been distinguished with the honour of being awarded the Colin Costorphin Award.

Attached to this newsletter is a form for members of our community to nominate a year 6 student for demonstrating our school values and contributing to school-life to an exemplary standard. A panel made up of our current School Council President David Barnes, a year 6 teacher, Andrew Veal and myself will then deliberate to make a decision on the candidate who best demonstrates our school's values and contributions.

PARENT OPINION SURVEY

WE WANT OUR PARENTS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK!

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents think of our school. The Parent Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is conducted amongst all parents. Preparing for pollen season and getting back to school

More than ever before, this year it is important for students to manage any hay fever or asthma symptoms, as these conditions can produce symptoms that are similar to coronavirus (COVID-19) such as a runny nose, cough or shortness of breath. This similarity is likely to cause challenges in differentiating between coronavirus (COVID-19) and hay fever or asthma symptoms and deciding if students should be excluded from school. This may affect students' education over spring and summer.

The best way to reduce and prevent symptoms of asthma or hay fever and reduce unnecessary absences from school is to follow an up-to-date asthma action plan or hay fever treatment plan.

Any students with a history of seasonal pollen-related symptoms, such as runny nose, sneezing or cough, should see their GP if they don't have an up-to-date plan.

Their GP can provide:

• a written asthma action plan or hay fever treatment plan, including what symptoms might suggest COVID-19 infection and require them to immediately get tested for COVID-19 and stay home until a negative result is received.

The GP can also advise if they need to get tested for coronavirus (COVID-19). In addition, national asthma management guidelines have recently been updated with new treatment options for Victorians with mild asthma.

Having good control of hay fever or asthma will not only make students feel better, it will help them more easily recognise symptoms that may be caused by coronavirus (COVID-19), so they can get tested and isolate sooner – protecting themselves and the community.

What are the symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19)?

The symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are:

- fever
- · chills or sweats
- cough
- · sore throat
- · shortness of breath
- · runny nose
- · loss of or change in sense of smell or taste.

In certain circumstances headache, muscle soreness, stuffy nose, nausea, vomiting and diarrhoea may also be symptoms.

A student while at school has symptoms, but they also get hay fever or asthma. What do I do?

Anyone with symptoms of COVID-19 that are different in any way to their usual hay fever or asthma symptoms should be tested for coronavirus (COVID-19) and should stay home until they receive their results.

People with known hay fever or asthma also need to talk to their GP about ongoing management.

A student test is negative but still has symptoms. What should I do?

If a student has symptoms and their coronavirus (COVID-19) test is negative, they should stay at home until they feel well. If their symptoms continue, they should talk to their GP.

How can a GP help?

A GP can help decide if treatment is needed or if the symptoms will go away by themselves. If the GP thinks the symptoms are because of hay fever or asthma, the GP should work with the student on a plan to best manage the symptoms and prevent them from recurring. People with hay fever or asthma symptoms who need to attend school in person should see their GP who can provide:

- advice on how to best treat symptoms and prevent them from recurring.
- an updated asthma action plan or hay fever treatment plan, including what symptoms might suggest COVID-19
 infection and require them to immediately get tested for COVID-19 and stay home until a negative result is
 received.



2020 COLIN CORSTORPHIN MEMORIAL AWARD

Each year the school confers its highest student honour, The Colin Corstorphin Memorial Award, upon one student from Year 6.

During his time as both parent (to Ross and Julia) and Council President, Colin was an active member of our community. He had a reputation of someone everyone looked up to; personable, respectful and always willing to give of his time with a vision of wanting our school to be the best. While he was a talented cricketer who represented Victoria, Colin immersed himself in school-life attending every working bee, organising school social events and coaching at the local Auskick centre.

Colin was someone who embodied our school values of *respect, responsibility, courage* and *persistence*. Tragically, Colin passed away in 1998 and his loss deeply impacted the school community. As a result, the school wanted to honour and remember both the vast contributions Colin made, but also more importantly the strong values that his character represented.

This Award, which is sponsored by the School Council, takes the form of a book prize (as do the school's academic Awards) but it carries a greater significance in that the name of each child conferred with the Award is recorded on the school's Honour Board.

To be eligible for the award a child must be in Year 6, have a demonstrated record of care, concern and acceptance for and of others, demonstrate the personal attributes of sound work habits, reliability, acceptance of responsibility, good organisational skills, initiative and approachability and have participated in a variety of school activities.

Any individual member of the school community (i.e. parent, staff member or student) or any affiliated group of the school community can nominate a student for this Award.

Nominations, which are to be made on the prescribed nomination form available from the school office, must address each of the selection criteria.

After a short-listing process the Award will be conferred by the School Council. This Award acknowledges the attributes of personal qualities, commitment and involvement as effectively demonstrated by our school's friend whose name it bears.

The closing date for nominations is Monday 1st December, 2020.
