PRINCIPAL'S REPORT



Significant Funding Announcement

On Tuesday afternoon we were informed that Templestowe Heights Primary School has received **\$13.1 million** funding for significant capital works. The funding is part of the state government's accelerated funding project, aimed at stimulating the economy and the good thing for us is that it means a short timeline.

The allocated funding is in direct response to the evaluation of census and demographic data, indicating that the population of 0-5year olds has significantly increased in the Lower Templestowe area. There is a projected enrolment increase of 125 more students in the coming years.

Over the next year we will be working with an architect firm, the Department of Education and the Victorian Schools Building Authority to design the concept, plans and provisions for what our school will transform into. There is scope for new builds and modifications to existing buildings. The plan will be that this time next year the designated sites will be shovel ready (complete with honorary golden shovel photo shoot), meaning in 12 months from now construction will commence. This is an unbelievably exciting opportunity and I feel so grateful that we now begin an exciting journey to plan what our school will look like for future generations.

There was a lot of excitement as the children walked up through the corridors, eyes wide open, curious, excited and anxious to experience all the new sights, sounds and smells of their new primary school. Ross Toogood's daughter Jasmine was one of those excited children, what a special moment it was. Thank you to the Foundation team of Jacqui, Ashleigh, Ross and the wonderful ES team of Navaara, Kirsty and Angelique for making the children feel so welcomed and comfortable.











2021 Class Formations - please trust us

I would like to reiterate what I mentioned in last weeks' newsletter, please <u>trust</u> our staff when placing your child in their class for 2021. Staff have spent countless hours creating the classes, following the guidelines of our class formation policy. It is a complex task where we take into consideration so many elements, using our professional experience from working with your child to ensure classes are; balanced socially, emotionally, academically, that there are minimal personality clashes, specific extenuating circumstances from some families, a balance of boys and girls as well as ensuring each child gets one friend from the list that they wrote down.

In week 10 (Tuesday 8th December) we will be having the first of two hour-long transition sessions. It is important that parents and carers are prepared for their child to come home and be unhappy after their first transition session. This is a normal reaction and typical behaviour, as change can be challenging for many children as they realise they are moving to a new space that is unfamiliar and new to them. This is a time when children will be moving out of their comfort zone and into the unknown. Please resist the temptation to contact us because you are concerned your child is not happy with the teacher, classroom or classmates. This is an aspect of how we grow resilience and something we all need to flourish as adults.

Farewell Staggers family

It is with great sadness we say farewell to the Staggers family. Benji, Alex, Charis and Isabel (now in secondary school) you have been such active, positive role models and made significant contributions as members of our community. We will miss you as you start another exciting chapter of your lives in Perth. Your new school will learn soon enough how lucky they are to have you. Please know you are welcome back anytime.

Reports learning growth

While it has been terrific to have all our students back at school, the past 6 months presented its challenges on many families. For many students, their learning was disrupted during online/remote learning. Due to this disruption, academic learning growth will look different for your child's semester 2 report. This is to be expected and it's ok.

The most important aspect of supporting students in their learning is identifying where their point of need is to ensure that our teachers know what content they need to teach to build understandings. Next year we will be receiving some funding for tutors to support students, the plan on how to effectively use our tutors will be developed as part of our annual plan for 2021.



Thank you for choosing to register your child in the Primary School Basketball Competition for season 1 2021 to represent Templestowe Heights Primary School. This competition is run by the Bulleen Boomers and takes place after school on various days depending on your child's age and gender. The season runs for 2 terms. Children from Grades 1 to 6 can take part.

Team Registrations will close on 6th December 2020, late registrations may not be accepted.

Below is some information about the competition:

Season 1 will commence on 22nd February and run through to late May with finals in June.

Coaches and managers are needed, we can't run a team without volunteers. Please let us know if you would like to volunteer.

Player Registration/Match fees - You will also need to register your child online with the Bulleen Boomers. The Boomers' season fee is usually around \$100 which covers the matches played for the season. We will provide you with the link when we receive it before the season starts.

Training – will be at school in the gym before, during or after school, depending on the coach and gym availability.

2020 COLIN CORSTORPHIN MEMORIAL AWARD

Each year the school confers its highest student honour, The Colin Corstorphin Memorial Award, upon one student from Year 6.

Colin Costorphin was a parent at Templestowe Heights Primary and served as School Council President from 1995-1998. During his time as both parent (to Ross and Julia) and Council President, Colin was an active member of our community. He had a reputation of someone everyone looked up to; personable, respectful and always willing to give of his time with a vision of wanting our school to be the best. While he was a talented cricketer who represented Victoria, Colin immersed himself in school-life attending every working bee, organising school social events and coaching at the local Auskick centre.

Colin was someone who embodied our school values of *respect, responsibility, courage* and *persistence*. Tragically, Colin passed away in 1998 and his loss deeply impacted the school community. As a result, the school wanted to honour and remember both the vast contributions Colin made, but also more importantly the strong values that his character represented.

This Award, which is sponsored by the School Council, takes the form of a book prize (as do the school's academic Awards) but it carries a greater significance in that the name of each child conferred with the Award is recorded on the school's Honour Board.

To be eligible for the award a child must be in Year 6, have a demonstrated record of care, concern and acceptance for and of others, demonstrate the personal attributes of sound work habits, reliability, acceptance of responsibility, good organisational skills, initiative and approachability and have participated in a variety of school activities.

Any individual member of the school community (i.e. parent, staff member or student) or any affiliated group of the school community can nominate a student for this Award.

Nominations, which are to be made on the prescribed nomination form available from the school office, must address each of the selection criteria.

After a short-listing process the Award will be conferred by the School Council. This Award acknowledges the attributes of personal qualities, commitment and involvement as effectively demonstrated by our school's friend whose name it bears.

The closing date for nominations is Monday 1st December, 2020.
