
Student Voice Elections

Congratulations again to all students who demonstrated our school values of courage and responsibility when they stood before their peers to deliver a speech as to why they should be elected Junior School Councillor or Environmental Leader. At next week's whole-school assembly, students who have been elected to these positions, as well as year 6 leaders will be presented with their badges. We are able to permit two adults per child to attend this assembly. Families will receive correspondence as to how they can register to attend.

Capital Works Update

Everything is on track as we continue to plan the concept-design for our new capital works project. The centre piece of this project is the construction of a double-story, senior school and state of the art STEAM (*Science Technology Engineering Arts Mathematics*) centre. The site for this has been earmarked for the back of the school, please see the 3D plans below. The design phase will be finalised by the end of the year, with construction commencing in December 2021 and to be

completed by the start of 2023. Enlarging the administration space and redeveloping the staffroom and toilet blocks are also part of the staged building works.

SCHOOL COUNCIL ELECTIONS



The Templestowe Heights Primary School Council is an elected body comprising 13 members: 7 parents, 4 DET employee members, 2 possible co-opted members and the Principal as Executive Officer. The term of office is 2 years. Each year, half of the Council comes due for election.

The School Council is a legally formed body that is given the power to set the key policies and directions of the school within centrally provided guidelines. In doing so, the School Council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for our students.

Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills that can help shape the direction of the school.

Those parents who become active on a school council find their involvement satisfying in itself and may also find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging.

If you decide you would like to nominate for school council, you can arrange for someone to nominate you as a candidate or you can nominate yourself in the Parent category.

Nomination forms are available at the office. You can either pick one up or call the office and we will send one home.

School Council meets at 7.30pm on the third Wednesday of each month. It operates sub committees in Finance, Community Engagement, Policies & Grants and Buildings & Grounds.

I hereby call for nominations for the Templestowe Heights Primary School Council.

The terms of office, membership categories and number of positions in each category open for election are as follows:

Nomination forms may be obtained from the school office and must be lodged by 4.00pm on Thursday 26th February.

SCHOOL COUNCIL ELECTIONS - INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

WHAT IS A SCHOOL COUNCIL AND WHAT DOES IT DO?

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within statewide guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

WHO IS ON THE SCHOOL COUNCIL?

For most primary school councils, there are three possible categories of membership:

- A mandated elected Parent category more than one-third of the total members must be from this category. Department employees can be Parent members at their child's school as long as they are not engaged in work at the school.
- A mandated elected school employee category members of this category may make up no more than one-third of the total membership of school council. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members.
- An optional community member category members are coopted by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests or experiences. Department employees are not eligible to be community members.

A small number of school councils have Nominee members.

For all schools with a Year 7 and above cohort, there is an additional category of membership:

A mandated elected student member category, with two positions.

Generally, the term of office for all members is two years. The term of office of half the members expires each year, creating vacancies for the annual school council elections.

WHY IS PARENT MEMBERSHIP SO IMPORTANT?

Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills that can help shape the direction of the school.

Those parents who become active on a school council find their involvement satisfying and may also find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging.

DO I NEED SPECIAL EXPERIENCE TO BE ON SCHOOL COUNCIL?

Each member brings their own valuable life skills and knowledge to the role. Councilors may need to develop skills and acquire knowledge in areas that are unfamiliar to them. What you do need is an interest in your child's school

and the desire to work in partnership with others to help shape the school's future.

HOW CAN YOU BECOME INVOLVED?

The most obvious way is to vote in the elections, which are held in Term one each year. However, ballots are only held if more people nominate as candidates than there are positions vacant.

In view of this, you might consider

- standing for election as a member of the school council
- encouraging another person to stand for election.

WHAT DO YOU NEED TO DO TO STAND FOR ELECTION?

The principal will issue a Notice of Election and Call for Nominations following the commencement of Term one each year. All school council elections must be completed by the end of March unless the usual time line has been varied by the Minister.

If you decide to stand for election, you can arrange for someone to nominate you as a candidate or you can nominate yourself in the Parent category.

Department employees whose child is enrolled in a school in which they are not engaged in work are eligible to nominate for parent membership of the school council at that school.

Once the nomination form is completed, return it to the principal within the time stated on the Notice of Election. You will receive a Nomination Form Receipt in the mail following the receipt of your completed nomination.

Generally, if there are more nominations received than there are vacancies on council, a ballot will be conducted during the two weeks after the call for nominations has closed.

REMEMBER

- Ask at the school for help if you would like to stand for election and are not sure what to do
- Consider standing for election to council this year
- Be sure to vote in the elections.

User Tips

Student Absences

If your child will be absent from school please record their absence on COMPASS.

- On your smart phone
 - Press the "Add Attendance Note" tab
 If you have more than 1 child at the school select the absent child
 - Tap on 'Reason' and select an option. (illness, parents' choice etc.) (Details/Comments field is <u>optional</u>)
 - 3. Tap on Start Date and End Date (change if necessary)
 - 4. Press 'Add Attendance Note'

Complete this process before 10.30am on the day of their absence

Recording Extended Absences

If your family is going on holidays please record your child's absence using the same process as above before the absence date. (Adjust the **Start Date** and **End Date** accordingly) and email your child's class teacher and the school office.

Absence Notifications

An SMS will be sent at 10.30am to all children recorded as 'Unexplained'. If you receive an SMS, please update the absence on **COMPASS** or call the school office.

COMPASS Notifications

Notification are sent via the app and email. To ensure you receive all notifications go to the settings on your phone and select "Enable Notifications".

♦ Late Arrivals Early departures

Late arrivals and early departures are recorded on the School Kiosk as your child arrives and departs the school via the office. Do not record these on Compass.

♦ School reports

Semester reports can be accessed by selecting your child's photo and pressing on the "Reports "tab

Booking Teacher Conferences (Parent Teacher Interviews)

- 1. Tap on the icon on the top left corner of your app
- 2. Select Conferences and follow the tabs to book a time with your childs teacher.

♦Events Consent (Incursions, Excursions, Permissions)

- 1. Tap on the icon on the top left corner of your app
- 2. Choose "Events" tab and follow the prompts.

If your family circumstances change, please notify the office so separate family **COMPASS** accounts can be created. Personal family details will be shared unless we are otherwise notified.

Chess is a wonderful game which enhances skills such as: Problem Solving, Pattern Recognition, Analytical, Visualisation, Concentration and Social Skills.


