Keeping Everyone Safe

In recent days we have observed a return of confirmed covid-positive cases within our student community. We will continue to follow the Department of Education's guidelines around recommended (and mandated) practices to keep us all safe. If your child presents with any cold/flu symptoms, they must stay home and we strongly encourage parents and carers to test for covid with a RAT or PCR test. Masks are available at the office for any student.

Scriviamo

This afternoon we had our Scriviamo writing celebration in our classrooms. The students had the opportunity to share their published writing pieces with classmates, parents and carers. Scrivamo exposed our students to learn about the features of different text types, draft pieces and then select one to edit, redraft and publish. A big congratulations to all our students, recognising that we can all be authors.

Master Class

On Wednesday Jade (Leon 5/6K and Atlas 1/2J), an architect presented a master class to the year 5/6 maths enrichment students. For several weeks, the students had been undertaking a project-based challenge on designing and creating a house, using geometric and measurement knowledge. Jade was able to break down the ideas behind the concepts in a simplified way so that the students got to understand how maths concept are linked to real-world scenarios.

Now that the big task of writing reports has been completed, our class teachers are creating grades for 2023. This is an extremely challenging task that we take seriously an
