# Important Information

#### EVERY DAY students must bring to school:

- School bag
- Blue school satchel
  - Decodable reader book and any notices for the teacher
- Drink bottle
- Lunchbox encouraging nude food and brain food
  - Lunch orders available via online Classroom Cuisine website. Available everyday except Tuesdays.
- School hats should remain at school in bag lockers during SunSmart dates (1<sup>st</sup> August – 31<sup>st</sup> May)
- We recommend bringing a change of clothes to keep in student's school bags



- Students are provided with decodable texts that directly link to our Phonics program




# Writing


## Classroom Helpers
