#### Parent/Carer Teacher Discussions

#### **NAPLAN Results**

On Friday our year 3 and 5 students will be receiving an envelope with the results from the National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN). We are so proud of the achievements of all of our students, who gave it their best efforts. Overall our school attained exceptionally high results, reflecting the quality of our teaching & learning programs, our talented, committed teachers and education support staff and of course our amazingly resilient students.

#### **Secondary School Placements for 2024**
