Maths Olympiad & Games

Congratulations to all students in years 3 & 4 who participated in the Maths Games as well as our Year 5 & 6 who participated in the Maths Olympiad competition. Pitted against peers from

This year the Enrichment Program has included the APSMO Maths Games and Maths Olympiad Competitions. These programmes encourage students to think




deeply and flexibly about maths ideas and strategies. This year over 30,000 students participated in these very tough competitions and overall, our students did exceptionally well!

2023 Math OLYMPIAD Awards and Achievements

Huge congratulations to the 2023 Maths Olympiad team, who were awarded a "Certificate of High Team Achievement'. This award is in recognition of the team's combined success, which saw them score in the top 20% of team scores in Division J. This is an outstanding achievement, and I thank everyone for their contribution.


