#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

#### **Our Transition Program**

The 2024 Foundation students had their fourth and final transition session on Friday. This final session was a half day where our newest students met their buddies. Next year there will be five Prep classes, meaning our foundation students will be our largest cohort as they move through the school- so look out!



This coming Tuesday from 2:15-3:15pm we will be having the first of two transition sessions. On these sessions the students will meet their new teacher, classmates and the classroom they will be in for 2024.

As I have mentioned previously, staff have spent countless hours creating the classes for 2024. In line with the Classroom Placement Policy, we aim to get the balance right and ensure every child has one of their five selected friends. Change is a big thing and every year there will always be children who are upset because they didn't get the exact friend or teacher they had hoped for.

As parents and carers it is only natural to want to advocate for our child and consider contacting the school to request changes. Dealing with small disappointments is part of life and it builds our resilience, a skill we need as adults. Please trust us and know that your child will be well looked after regardless of what class they are in for 2024.

#### **FIRST AID NEWS**

#### Thunderstorm asthma and Hay Fever— be prepared this pollen season

Grass pollen season, which runs from October to December each year, brings an increase in asthma and hay fever symptoms. It also increases the risk of <a href="mailto:thunderstorm.">thunderstorm.</a> asthma. For people with asthma or hay fever, especially those who experience wheezing or coughing with their hay fever, thunderstorm asthma can be sudden, serious and even life threatening.

Templestowe Heights Primary School will implement a range of measures to keep our school community safe when the risk of thunderstorm asthma increases.

Many of our staff are trained in asthma first aid, and we will monitor the VicEmergency app to receive thunderstorm warnings, and, where appropriate, keep students indoors when weather forecasts identify greater level of risk.

#### How you can prepare

During pollen season, there are some things you can do to prepare and protect yourself and your family:

- If your child has ever had asthma: talk to your doctor about what you can do to help protect your child from the risk of thunderstorm asthma, including updating your asthma action plan. Taking an asthma preventer properly and regularly is key to preventing asthma, including thunderstorm asthma.
- If your child has hay fever: see your pharmacist or doctor for a hay fever treatment plan and check if you should have an asthma reliever puffer. These are available from a pharmacy without a prescription.
- If your child has hay fever and experiences wheezing and coughing: it is important to make sure they don't also have asthma. Speak to your doctor about an asthma action plan.
- Where possible, avoid being outside during thunderstorms from October to December, especially during the
  wind gusts that come before the storm. Go inside and close your doors and windows. If you have your air
  conditioning on, turn it to 'recirculate'.

Protect yourself this pollen season – managing asthma and allergies matters.

If your child suffers from hay fever please have a pharmacist or doctor fill out the attached Allergic Rhinitis treatment plan so appropriate medication can be administered to your child if required.


