Parent/Carer Teacher Discussions

Thank you to all our families who made a time to meet their child's class teacher. These discussions are an opportunity for families to meet the teacher to discuss their progress and future learning. As always, we have a big turnout, indicating how important our community values the home-school partnership. Well done also to some of our students for attending, particularly those who came in their pyjamas!

Whole School Assembly

This Friday we will be hosting our first whole school assembly for **all students in Year 1-6**. The assembly will be held in the gymnasium at 2:45pm with the special event of all Junior School Councillors and Enviro Leaders receiving their badges. These assemblies are planned and run by our Year 6 Captains, they are very excited (and a little nervous) to be running their first one. All members of our community are welcome to attend.

Cyber Safety Sessions

As part of our Child Safety policy, all students in years 5 and 6 will be participating in cyber-safety workshops in March. These sessions, facilitated by Evolve Education, help students to develop strategies for managing negative online behaviour and to de-escalate digital drama. They also detail a person's rights online, in particular, information about online behaviour and the law.

Welcome Picnic Next Thursday

Next Thursday (7th March) our wonderful *Parents & Friends* will be hosting our annual Welcome Picnic. The purpose is for our community to come together and welcome the start of the school year. It is also an opportunity for children, parents and carers to put faces to names and chat with THPS staff. The event runs from 5:30-7:30pm on our school oval and families are able to come along with their own dinner, snacks, drinks and of course a picnic rug. There will be a jumping castle for the younger children and an obstacle course for the older children. A drinks/icy pole station will also be available.

NAPLAN

In a fortnight's time, our year 3 and 5 students will participate in the National Assessment for Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN). NAPLAN is now completed online (with the exception of year 3 writing test which is paper and pencil) and

it measures each child's knowledge and understandings in key areas of reading, writing, language conventions and numeracy.

As a school we have never focussed on providing our students with countless practices tests, rather we have focussed on quality teaching. Our dedicated year 3 and 5 teachers have provided our students with opportunities to ensure when they sit these tests they are prepared and confident. Regardless of the outcome, all we ever ask is our students give it their best effort.
