PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Cross Country

On Wednesday afternoon all students in years 3-6 participated in the House Sports Cross Country event. It was pleasing to see the smiles on the students' faces as they ran the 1km course that took them out of the school grounds, up High Street, down Lynwood Parade, onto Templestowe College's oval and then back finally onto THPS' oval.



The older students showed maturity and set paces that they were able to hold throughout the entire distance, whilst the first timer year 3 students continued the tradition of sprinting the first 200metres before getting stitches and walking. Everyone got into the House spirit with their loud encouragement and cheering. The Impact of Being Late to School

Whilst we know morning times can be a challenge for busy families, it is so important that we aim to get our children to school before 9am. Our classrooms open at 8:45am and are an opportunity for students to set themselves up for the day. The statistics on the following page paint a picture of just how important it is to get to school on time, as missing the first five minutes of learning time each day equates to the equivalence of missing three and a half school days each year.

Nobody likes being late. Walking into a classroom once a lesson has commenced can also create anxiety for children. So please, if you are having any difficulty getting your child to school by 9am, please contact your child's teacher or speak to either myself or Andrew Veal, as we are all here to help.

5 Minutes	3.4 Days
10 Minutes	6.9 Days
15 Minutes	10.3 Days
20 Minutes	13.8 Days
30 Minutes	20.7 Days

Behaviour Curriculum

Recently you may have seen the media

regarding new guidelines on how schools can help ensure students behave appropriately. The new framework, created by the Australian Education Research Organisation (AERO), found that teachers can spend up to 20% of their day dealing with disruptions which equates to one day per week. At Templestowe Heights, we have created a behaviour curriculum, that we introduced at the start of the year and follows the guidelines set out by AERO.

All staff have worked very hard this year in creating a safe, orderly and calm learning environment. By setting clear, high expectations, consistent routines and clear rules provides all students with a sense of predictability and conditions for them to achieve their optimal best. 
Foundation 2025 Enrolments
