Victoria Auditor General Office (VAGO) Report

Recently the VAGO published a report into the review of the Tutor Learning Initiative (TLI). The TLI was an action borne from the lockdowns to support all government schools with additional funding to hire tutors to bridge the learning gaps as a result of the covid pandemic. While the report identified a whole list of reasons why the tutoring initiative was not successful, it was not the story for Templestowe Heights Primary.

In a recent visit an evaluation from the Department of Education on our TLI, we received the highest possible outcome based on a set criteria. We use a research-based intervention program for identified students through assessments of having gaps in their knowledge. The impact that these sessions have had on our students has been extremely positive and we have felt the funding we received has significantly added value to our school programs.

I want to acknowledge Stuart McLay, who is leading and delivering our tutor program. Being an ex-secondary school English and Literature teacher, his knowledge and own professional growth in learning our structured

phonics THPS curriculum has helped him deliver on such a hugely successful program.

Fly Me Out of Here!

Students in year 6 have been learning about flight propulsion and aerodynamics during their STEM lessons. Students have made aeroplanes, complete with motors and now have a chance to fly a plane in a simulator. A massive thank you to Ross Johnston from the Doncaster Squadron of the Australian Air League for lending the simulator for our school and to pilot Craig (Avery 4SM) who ran master class sessions for our students. Lastly, thanks Ross Toogood for providing such an engaging and unique experience for our students.

Swinburne Psychology Clinic

University have developed a
program to help parents manage
childhood anxiety in children
aged 6-11 years.

Does your child experience any of the following?

- Difficulties sleeping at night due to worries
- · Fears and phobias
- Difficulty separating from you or worrying about parental safety
- Trouble sleeping alone in their bed
- · Fear of the dark
- · Scared of lifts, trains, and people
- · Fear of dogs and other animals
- Excessive worry and constant reassurance seeking
- Fear of germs and other health problems

The One Step at a Time Program involves:

- Comprehensive psychological assessment of your child's anxiety
- Seven sessions of online counselling through video conferencing
- Parent-focused cognitive behavioral therapy (CBT) skills to help you manage and support your child's anxiety
- Two combined parent-child sessions
- Reflective parenting strategies
- Access to a website with selfhelp materials to supplement therapy.

Cost

\$20 per session/assessment. Treatment consists of seven therapy sessions plus one assessment session.
