



BASKETBALL NEWS HOOP TIME REGISTRATIONS NOW OPEN!

Hoop Time is back for 2025!

The Hoop Time program offers kids in Grade 3 and 4 (junior) and Grade 5 and 6 (senior) the opportunity to play in a fun competition. The program culminates at the end of each year with Regional Finals and a State Grand Final day. Changes to the Hoop Time program for 2025 include:

- Introducing Future Stars (mixed) and Future Stars (girls only), there will be no on court ratio parameters in Future Stars (mixed).
- Due to the significant growth of Basketball Victoria's representative competition (VJBL), we have put in place further clarity around the level played by your students, that makes a player ineligible for Future Stars.

Any players who compete in the VJBL in Victorian Junior League 5 (VJL5) or above must play in the All Star division. Any player who represents their association in the Junior Country Championships (JCC) in that year, must play in the All Star division. If a player fits just one of these two categories, they must play All Stars and are deemed ineligible for the Future Stars and Rookies divisions.

Important Information:

Age Groups: Junior (Grade 3 & 4) and Senior (Grade 5 & 6)

Divisions: All Star Boys, All Star Girls, Future Stars (mixed), Future Stars (girls only) and Rookies

Cost: \$110 per team, inclusive of GST



Child Care Subsidy



Please note that subsidised hours are calculated and allocated by Centrelink on a fortnightly basis. Check Centrelink for eligibility.

Fortnightly childcare Subsidised hours

Each session is calculated using the full service operational hours, not the hours attended by the child.

Additional Child Care subsidy will not cover any hours beyond the subsidised hours per fortnight.

More than 5 days	Less than 5 days *	On the day
No Charge	\$10.00	Full Fee

*Less than 5 days from the start of the booking (120 hours from the start of the session).

When making additional bookings, the \$10.00 fee is eligible for the Child Care Subsidy, which means you may only need to pay the gap, depending on your families' circumstances.
