#### SCHOOL SAVING BONUS REMINDER AND ALLOCATION TO SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

The SSB can be used for uniforms and textbooks until Monday 30 June 2025.

Any funds remaining after 30 June 2025, including online voucher amounts that have not been redeemed, will become a credit to use on school activities. However, the credit will not be available on your family account at our school until late July.

To use any remaining SSB funds to cover the cost of school activities in July, please refer to the <u>SSB online system</u> and allocate the funds to school activities before 30 June 2025.

### MOANA UPDATE.

Dear THPS Community,

I hope you are all well. Moana the Guide Dog Pup is now 12 months of age.

She has been in and out of shops, big and small, travelled on trains, buses and trams, gone up and down open stairs and looked over the edge at the train station. All very big things for a young pup. In the meantime, she has been happy in the classroom of 3EJ and all of THPS, wooing visitors and having children learning to be calm around her.

Now it is time for her to leave us. On Monday, she goes off for assessment, to see if she makes the grade to go into Guide Dog Training proper.

Puppy Raising, as I do, is like primary and secondary school for pups, all mixed up. Guide Dog Training is like Guide Dog University. If Moana is successful, she will go on to train for 5 months and eventually be matched with a low-vision or blind person. It's amazing that a young pup can become a working dog by about the age of two or two-and-a-half.

There are other careers for pups that are reclassified out of training. They can go to work with someone with PTSD.

They can become Therapy Dogs for those with chronic illnesses or they can become Companions for those who need them. Rarely, but sometimes, they go on to become Border Force dogs. Lastly, they can become Domiciliary Dogs, or pets.

Moana is a sweet dog. She loves affection and would sit on your lap with her legs round your neck, if she could. She loves to play and romp, like any pup. She tosses favourite toys, chews on toy bones, runs and jumps and loves to squeeze under my bed! However, when she is wearing her jacket, she knows it's time to work.

Again, as through all the years, I thank you for your support. I could not do this without Mr. Coulson, my colleagues and all of you.

With me, let's wish Moana well on her way. Best paws forwards, girl! Kind regards and thank you to all of you.

Someone will be very grateful for our work and support.


