On Tuesday our year 2 students had an excursion to Pound Bend,



Policies Update



Hoop Time

Yesterday three teams representing Templestowe Heights Primary School, participated in the Junior Hoop Time competition. Grade 3 boys, Matthew, Ashton, Archie, Aiden, Max and Dion entered the Future Stars Mixed competition (Grade 3 & 4 boys and girls) and were coached by Tom Paterson and Hamish Rowe. The boys went undefeated in all six games played, winning the Grand Final 26 to 14 against some tough competition.

Grade 3 girls, Sophie, Ruby, Olive, Amelia, Aria, Erin and Chelsea entered the Future Stars Girls competition (Grade 3 & 4 girls) and were coached by Andrew Dolezal. The girls also went undefeated in all five games played, taking out the Grand Final, 14 to 4.
