There are a large number of unnamed items in our lost property tub. Please ensure all items bought to school are clearly labelled so that they may be easily returned.


All unnamed items in the lost property tub will be periodically donated to the second-hand uniform shop.

HAY FEVER AND THUNDERSTORM ASTHMA

Grass pollen season typically runs from October to December each year in Victoria, and we are already seeing an increase in asthma and hay fever symptoms at the school. It also increases the risk of thunderstorm asthma.

If your child suffers from Asthma or Hay Fever, please ensure that your treatment action plans are up to date and that where prescribed, asthma preventers are taken properly. Consider whether your child should take an antihistamine at home before school or whether medication needs to be kept in the First Aid Room for them.

Week 3: Discover how to deal with children's feelings of fear, frustration and grief to become an emotionally intelligent parent


