#### SAFETY AT PICK UP AND DROP OFF

We all have busy lives and we all have somewhere else we need to get to. There are no excuses however, for irresponsible or dangerous behaviours when dropping our children off or picking them up. We are all role models to our children and we want them to grow up as adults who take care when crossing roads or when driving.



Some reminders to eliminate dangerous behaviours that could lead to severe consequences:

- We are on a busy main road so it is imperative that <u>parents and carers cross at traffic pedestrian crossings</u>.
- Double parking is illegal and it is dangerous.
- U-turns out the front of the school on High Street are extremely dangerous and illegal.

We have also had complaints from local residents about school parents parking across their driveways – this is illegal and disrespectful.

#### **SECOND HAND UNIFORM SHOP**

#### Do you know about the school's second-hand uniform shop?



Located near the school office, the second-hand uniform shop is a great way to replenish uniforms on a budget! We have clothing available from size 4 to 16 - with a lot of clothing in sizes 12 and 14 (which is particularly good when you have a student in year six and don't want to purchase a whole new uniform with only half the year left!)

For official/logo items (jumpers, jackets, dresses, school bags etc) the price is \$5 per piece, and for non-logo items (shorts, skorts, track pants etc) the price is \$2 per piece.

If you have uniform items at home that you no longer require, you can donate them by bringing them to the front office. Please ensure they are clean and in good condition – would you buy the item in its current condition? Please note: we only accept t-shirts, jumpers and jackets with the school logo, not generic items.

The uniform shop is available for browsing most afternoons – unless there are meetings in the room next door – so please check with staff before going into the room.

### HAY FEVER AND THUNDERSTORM ASTHMA

Grass pollen season typically runs from October to December each year in Victoria, and we are already seeing an increase in asthma and hay fever symptoms at the school. It also increases the risk of thunderstorm asthma.

If your child suffers from Asthma or Hay Fever, please ensure that your treatment action plans are up to date and that where prescribed, asthma preventers are taken properly. Consider whether your child should take an antihistamine at home before school or whether medication needs to be kept in the First Aid Room for them.
